## Champagne Cocktails

**Champagne Charlie** £10.00 (Champagne and Apricot Brandy) Named in memory of Charles Camille Heidsieck. His remarkable salesmanship and 'Mr Good Time' reputation earned him the nickname Champagne Charlie.

**Classic Champagne Cocktail** £10.00 (Champagne, Brandy and Sugar)  
In 1864 John Dougherty stumbled across a unique American cocktail. Twenty five years later a New York journalist organised a Cocktail Competition. John Dougherty entered what was to become the Classic Champagne Cocktail and won first prize.

**French 75** £10.00 (Champagne, Gin, Lemon Juice and Sugar) After the First World War, during celebrations at Henry's Bar in Paris, Henry added champagne to a gin-based cocktail called the 75. The French 75 was born.

## Cocktail Martinis

The Cocktail Martini became popular in the early part of the twentieth century. Italian immigrants were probably responsible for the trend since it was their practice to mix Martini Rosso with Gin. As the practice developed Martini Rosso was replaced by Dry Martini and Gin was replaced by Vodka. Now Cocktail Martinis are made with either Gin or Vodka and any kind of Martini. They are very personal drinks, so tell us how you like yours and we'll oblige.

**Wet Martini** £8.00 (Martini and Bombay Sapphire Gin) To celebrate the end of prohibition President Franklin D. Roosevelt mixed his favourite Martini in front of television cameras. It became known as the Wet Martini because it marked the end of America's 'dry spell'.

**Big Apple Martini** £8.00 (Belvedere Vodka, Apple Schnapps and Apple Sourz) This drink was created in Manhattan for the Millennium.

**Gibson Martini** £8.00 (Gordon's Gin or Grey Goose Vodka with Vermouth and a cocktail onion) At the Player's Club in New York Mr Charles Gibson requested that a cocktail onion be served in his Martini instead of an olive. This simple act sparked a world-wide craze.

## Classic Cocktails

**Margarita** £8.00 (Jose Cuervo Silver Tequila, Triple Sec and Fresh Lime Juice) In 1948 renowned actress Marjorie King was a regular at Rancho la Gloria, near Tijuana (Mexico). She was allergic to most spirits apart from tequila, so the owner, Danny Herrera, created a special drink for her. He named it 'Margarita', Mexican for Marjorie.

**Long Island Ice Tea** £8.00 (Tanqueray Gin, Skyy Vodka, Jose Cuervo Gold Tequila, Bacardi Rum and Cointreau) Created in the 1970s by Robert 'Rosebud' Butt at the Oak Beach Inn (Hampton Bay, New Jersey).

**Moscow Mule** £8.00 (Vodka, Ginger Beer and Fresh Lime Juice) In 1947 John Martin of Heublien & Co. acquired the right to import Smirnoff vodka to the U.S. His friend, Jack Morgan, owned the Cock and Bull Saloon in L.A. and happened to have a surplus of Ginger Beer. They pooled their resources and added Fresh Lime Juice, so creating the Moscow Mule.

**Harvey Wallbanger** £8.00 (Skyy Vodka, Galliano and Orange Juice) Myth has it that sometime in the 1970s a Californian surfer by the name of Harvey decided to add an extra kick to his Screwdriver. After sampling his creation he was seen bumping into furniture and walls: so earning the nickname Wallbanger for himself. His drink then became known as the Harvey Wallbanger.

**Mai Tai** £8.00 (Bacardi White and Oro Rum, Triple Sec, Almond Syrup, Grenadine and Fresh Lime Juice) In 1944 the legendary Victor Bergeron created a cocktail using 17 year old J. Wray & Nephew Rum. When he introduced it to Hawaii it was so popular the world's supply of the rum was exhausted within the year. Today the Mai Tai is made with a blend of rums: much more sustainable!
